<b>Beyond Words—Skills and Tools Workshop:</b> <i>Children grieve as much as adults do, but they often need a different language for expressing their grief—the language of play and art. This seminar presents tools for working with bereaved children.</i>		
<b>Bereavement Support for Children with Disabilities:</b> <i>A fascinating case study on supporting a disabled young person from before the death of a parent through the journey of bereavement.</i>		
<b>The Bereaved Family:</b> <i>Personal and theoretical perspective on the experience of a bereaved family; support needs and resources based on developmental stages and family dynamics.</i>		
<b>Pre-Bereavement and Anticipatory Work:</b> <i>This seminar shows how preparation for loss can contribute to the healing process and memory work following a death.</i>		
<b>Supporting Young People in the Aftermath of Suicide:</b> <i>Reflects on the multifaceted nature of the impact of suicide on a young person, including the role the person played in their life, their own support systems, and intrapersonal factors.</i>		
<b>Dealing with Critical Incidents:</b> <i>No school is exempt from having to deal with critical incidents, which can have a traumatic effect on students and staff alike. This seminar offers good practice guidelines and points the way to a wide range of useful resources.</i>		
<b>Supporting Bereaved Children in our Multi-Cultural Society:</b> <i>Looking at our own definitions of difference, identity and citizenship; developing a sense of belonging for <b>all</b> bereaved children and young people in our community.</i>
